here is a continous increase of refugees receiving free treatment in our clinic due to the still ongoing conflict in the anglophone regions of Cameroon, The number of consultations in our clinics raised to more than 80,000 (eighty thousand).

Three co-workers were sent to Gambia for further training. One was dismissed due to stealing.

One member of the Management Team of the Clinic was successfully operated in Germany.

The number of refugee children sent to school increased to 176.

2 workers from CDC (Cameroon Development Cooperation) received inservice training in our clinic for 3 months.

Staff:

We are 61 co-workers of whom 21 are working in the permanent outstations in Bamenda and Douala.

Problems:

Eye consultation in outreach stations in the anglophone regions of Cameroon are still limited due to the ongoing war in this area.

The patients suffering from corneal ulcers are still a big problem in our clinic.

There is a high Government restriction to pay bills abroad with CFA. We are forced to pay in EUROS which we do not have.

As a result of the Pandemie the prices of medicines, freight charges and custom duties in Cameroon have very much increased.

Further Plans:

- 1. Continuation of training in Gambia.
- 2. Contineous education in the clinic and outreach stations about the dangers of glaucoma and native medicine for eyes.
- 3. Intensify the inservice training of the staff in Nkongsamba and in the outstation clinics.
